Meeting Minutes

- I. Welcome & Introductions Dwayne T. Woods
Meeting called to order at 8:33 A.M.
- II. Sub-Committee Reports
- A. Education & Resource Natalie Storms
- Natalie updated the group on the progress of the C.A.A.N.E. Expo, there are four sponsorships and four non-profit agencies confirmed, speakers are confirmed, a timeframe for sponsorships will be established at a later date, venue is confirmed, a sample flyer has been created, and Eventbrite registration has been created. The next items on the agenda will be to identify the caterer, gifts, and door prizes.
 - Brooke said we've collected \$2k in C.A.A.N.E. sponsorship funds to date.
- B. Case Review Brooke Lynch
Brooke provided an update from January's 2020 case review, with the assistance of a POA they were successful with getting a protection order and client relocated to an assisted living facility.
- C. Emergency Response Kerry Smoot
- Kerry met with Kettering Health Network and they agreed to support the Emergency Response team evaluations. Kerry will also work with Eli to create a guardianship and promise to pay form. Since guardianship is independent, C.A.A.N.E.'s involvement in creating forms won't be required. Kerry has been in contact with the Chief of Police regarding transportation, the Chief said once CIT is up and running, they can discuss working together. The city of Dayton police will be the contact for all city residents, and the sheriff will be the contact for everyone else who resides outside of the city.
 - The Director in the sheriff's office said the CIT officers will be trained to work and correspond with mental health and addiction patients. They are interviewing with Eastway and South Community responders, and Captain Brown and Herron will be able to assign community partners, and 80% of deputies have CIT training.
 - Kerry mentioned there will be an ER meeting immediately following the C.A.A.N.E. meeting, and there will be a discussion on creating a list of places for placement. Natalynne mentioned Jessica has a team and should be kept in the loop regarding ER. Kerry said there are guardians who are joining, and we have enough resources for them.
- D. Advocacy (OCAPS) Brooke Lynch
Brooke informed the group that the OCAPS Conference is scheduled for March 13, 2020, there is a board meeting scheduled tomorrow, and registration to participate is open.

III. Hot Topics

Group

- Eli introduced David who is an attorney, David may be another potential resource to the group. Eli has been working 85 hours weekly and was unable to provide support to APS because of his caseloads.
- Dwayne spoke about The Collaboration being a great resource, and to speak with him after their meeting for their contact information.

Natalynne shared that St. Mary's will take ownership of **The Biltmore Towers** beginning April 1, 2020, they will offer health care and rehabilitation services to their clients. The goal will be 30 rehab units and clients at a time. There are currently multiple building violations, so they will start shifting out old and new units, and units for people receiving passport. Dwayne asked Natalynne about the cost to rehab, Natalynne said it is a proposed 4.2 million, with a government tax credit, consisting of new elevators, roofs, outside renovation, hard surface flooring in every apartment, and line reconstruction. The eta is December 2021. St. Mary's is speaking with Kettering Health Network about retail space, and servicing the outside community, and, a primary goal will be to have primary care physicians onsite.

- Dakota Center inquired with the group on recommendations for seniors who go to the hospital and are experiencing medical insurance coverage issues. The recommendations were Pink Ribbon Girls for Care, have client refuse to sign discharge papers, and have client speak with the patient advocates at the hospital.
- Capital Health referred providers to call 937-279-0641 for VA and WPAFB, VA contracts for new member introductions.
- Catholic Social Services out of Sidney, is hosting an event called "PASSPORT Provider Fair: Aging in Place" in Piqua on Wednesday April 8th, from 8am -2:30pm at Edison College. The cost will be \$15 which includes lunch, Medicaid fraud 101 presentation, session on dementia, and pet therapy.
